Justification to Return to Training / Gaelic Games

To return to training, play challenge games or commence any CCC fixtures requires all clubs to have approval from their County Board.

Clubs should adhere to necessary guidelines and provide evidence to the CB they have met the 5 requirements stated in the PCB statement. Note: item 5 is new.

Additionally you have commenced uploading evidence on a weekly basis into the County SharePoint

Your commitment and effort as a Club Executive will deliver a safe and compliant return to Gaelic Sports.

- Go to https://learning.gaa.ie/covid19 and read the guidelines, watch the webinar that took place on the 16th, complete the online education module, watch the health questionnaire video and read the Frequently Asked Questions.
- 2. Establish within your club who needs to a Covid Supervisor. Then discuss and agree how you will engage and communicate between each other. This will be time consuming.
- 3. This week set aside time to read through and familiarise yourself with the GAA resources, Signage and Posters. Click on this link https://learning.gaa.ie/covid19resources which will take you to that. Note, the website and resources will be updated regularly.
- 4. Please keep an eye on the news section on a daily basis.







Club and CB Actions

Working together:

- 1. Read, understand and apply UK Government COVID 19 Guidance at your facility/pitch. See next slide
- 2. Read, understand and apply the PCB UPDATED SAFE RETURN Master September and specifically the Code of Conduct
- Document county and club arrangements for managing COVID controls at your facility/pitch. Provide a risk assessment and consideration to having a CB – Club Safety Plan (Delivery Plan) outlining your arrangements. Consider guidance from Sports England. https://learn.sportenglandclubmatters.com/course/view.php?id=71
- On a weekly basis download into the CB SharePoint records of training, health questionnaires, training records, pitch inspections and fixture checklists.
- 5. For all fixtures, comply with Regulations Governing the Organisation and Presentation of Warwickshire document
- 6. All of the above supports compliance to guidelines







